<u>New Course</u>: Bangalore University has accorded permission to conduct. One year PG Diploma course in Auditory Verbal Therapy and awaiting inspection. from Rehabilitation Council of India.

Dr. Rashmi Bhat had attended the Principal's meeting of Bengaluru North University and they were very encouraging and supportive. They have also informed that they will approve our fellow ship programs and help us in conducting seminars and workshops.

A part of the cultural fees collected by University also will be given back to the college for conducting internal activities. Vice Chancellor of Bengaluru North University has emphasized that colleges have to adopt schools/village and take up welfare activities as well as be a part of Swatch Bharath movement.

The Management accorded permission to start the Certificate courses even with one or two candidates. The members informed that the minimum period of the certificate courses will be of 6 months duration to be approved by the University.

- a) A week-long free hearing screening camp from 2nd March, 2020 to 7th March 2020 was conducted at the institute as a part of World Hearing Day.
- b) Awareness programs at rural and urban areas on the hearing loss and the management options available were carried out. The target audience at the urban area were the general public and in the rural areas, it was the people who attended the Hearing Screening Camp. The mannequin developed by the institute, called the 'Karna' a replica of 'Jouline' created by Dangerous Decibels headed by Dr Billy Martin measures the levels of music played by one's personal music system in the ear. This mannequin was used in the hearing screening camps to create awareness about the hazardous effect of recreational hearing.
- c) A 'Cyclothon' was organized in the heart of the city on 7th March 2020. This event was covered by local news channels, was published in local newspapers, and attracted a sizeable amount of people.
- d) A cultural programme was conducted for children using cochlear implants.
- Regular updates on technical and non technical aspects of the field are provided through social media platform such as Facebook and Linkedin to general public.
- f) Crowd source fundraising efforts have begun towards establishing neonatal hearing screening at District Hospitals.

Admissions

The Bengaluru North University Counselling was held during December 2020 and the classes commenced from January 2021. There are 18 students in MASLP, 9 in M.Sc Audiology & 12 in M.Sc Speech Language Pathology.

AT

Regarding PGDAVT Course the intake sanctioned is 10 but there are no admissions for 2020-21. For the year 2019-20 there are 3 students (2 of them inhouse) and their exam schedule to be received from the University.

D.SE (HI) - The intake for D.SE (HI) is 25 but we have only one student admitted to the course for 2020-21. It was explained to the members that the reason is that the students have to pass the online examination conducted by RCI. Previously RDT, Anantapur used to send us the candidates and now they have stopped sending the candidates for D.SE (HI).

<u>Short term courses</u>: 3 batches of Fellowship program in Swallowing and 1 batch of fellowship in Cochlear Implant is completed. A 6 month program with Swiss Audiology Academy (In association with Phonak) for students who completed BASLP on Hearing Aid fitting has been prepared and details are getting worked out.

<u>Doctoral Research Status</u>: 3 students under the guideship of Dr. Premalatha have submitted thesis for adjudication to Bangalore University. 4 students under MAHE have finished their First DAC meetings and are pursuing their mandatory coursework.

Under Bengaluru North University 4 guides are recognized but we are awaiting Notification.

<u>Courses offered by us to other colleges</u>: Sign Language course completed for two batches of Mount Carmel students and UG students of St. Anne's Rehab Science are undertaking Sign Language as well as a course on Learning Disability.



The results of IV Sem MASLP, M.Sc Speech Language Pathology and M.Sc Audiology courses of September 2020 Examination were presented i.e MASLP – 95%, M.Sc (Speech Language Pathology) & M.Sc (Audiology) – 100% results.

The results of V Semester BASLP were declared and the pass percentage is 72.09 i.e. out of the 43 students 31 students have passed.

The members of the Governing Council appreciated the results of PG programs and wanted to know the reason for the lesser pass percentage in UG as compared to PG courses. It was explained that there were failures from this batch of students from the beginning of the 1st year.

Chairperson opined that it could be due to poor English proficiency of the students. Mr. Shanthavadhan, treasurer of the Trust and Management Committee member said that efforts are being taken to engage the services of an English Instructor.



The Examination for 1st and 3rd semester BASLP was postponed due to pandemic and will be commencing from 9th August 2021. Draft time table received from the University.

Affiliation & Inspection status

- RCI Inspection for M.Sc Audiology, M.Sc Speech Language Pathology, DSE HI courses is due for 2021. The SSR has been submitted online and we are awaiting inspection. MASLP course has been discontinued from this academic year 2021-22.
