


at risk of developing hearing difficulties due to being exposed to continuous traffic noise.

### INTRODUCTION:

- The novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) and its corresponding disease (COVID-19) have dramatically impacted people's mental health and behaviour
- College students are among the most strongly affected by COVID-19 because of uncertainty regarding academic success, future careers, and social life during college, amongst other concerns
- Even before the pandemic, students, experienced increasing levels of anxiety, depressive moods, lack of self-esteem, psychosomatic problems, substance abuse, and suicidal ideas

### Why social emotional learning for emotional wellbeing?

- Socio-emotional learning (SEL) broadly refers to the acquisition of a wide range of skills and attributes, which are considered critical to students' development, with myriad terms used interchangeably to refer to this conceptual space (Duckworth & Yaeger, 2015)
- According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), "mental health is a state of well-being in which an individual realizes his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively, and is able to make a contribution to his or her community.
- Building social and emotional learning skills can help individuals respond to difficult and unexpected situations in a calm and emotionally regulated manner, enabling them to set out and develop strategies for dealing with difficult circumstances, and to interact and work with others to address problems (Arslan and Demirtas, 2016; Education Links, 2018).

### **Emotional well-being is focused on:**

### **Happiness**



Is a state of mind or a mood. Individuals are usually happier when they're satisfied with their lives and relationships, although nobody is happy all the time.

### Wellbeing



Comes from physical, mental and emotional health. It's also about understanding your emotions, taking part in different activities, having good relationships and social connections, finding meaning in life and feeling that you're doing well.

### PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

- The **Happiness and Emotional wellbeing** Program aims at building Resilience- an ability to bounce back from every day difficult situation or problems and to creatively redefine a sense of confidence and self-compassion.
- Through this program we help your learn 4 qualities to that help you to be resilient and confident to cope with you current situations.
- Each quality is done across 04 weeks an assessment to understand the quality and activity and application document shared to students.
- Final year Msc students attending the Counselling paper were trained on implementation of the program
- The program was implemented on all UG students of our college
- All UG students were divided into groups and mentored by the trained PG students
- Pre and post assessment of the OXFORD HAPPINESS QUESTIONNAIRE will be done to understand the efficacy of the Program, at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> week

3<sup>rd</sup> BSLPA has obtained shown an improvement in the happiness quotient, from being unhappy before the program and as the 04 weeks completed, the activities helped them to be very happy.

Overall the program has benefitted the student's well-being and happiness during the pandemic as the group mean scores indicate that before attending the program students were not particularly happy or unhappy , as compared to the results post the program as the students obtained an Average score , and were Happy .
